

The Eastern Star Masonic Retirement Campus has been dedicated to serving seniors since 1931. We offer mid-range pricing with no buy-in fees for our apartments and patio homes, making it an attractive option for many in the Denver area facing rising housing costs.

The Robert Russell building, a beautiful and historic structure, provides care for 42 assisted living residents. In line with our non-profit mission to offer affordable care, this building continues to provide lower-priced assisted living, with some apartments reserved for Medicaid recipients. Another option is our Barry building, which opened in 2014 and accommodates 48 assisted living residents.

Our campus also includes a secure Memory Care Neighborhood with 20 apartments. This neighborhood features an activity room, family room, sunroom, and a cheerful dining room. Residents can also enjoy a secure outdoor courtyard to get fresh air and appreciate the flowers.

Additionally, we offer attractive patio homes built between 1989 and 1991. These 58 homes are designed for independent seniors, featuring floor plans with no steps, an oversized one-car garage, and a large, covered patio. Residents live independently without the hassle of maintenance, mowing, watering, or shoveling.


















# **Memory Care Recap**
